Harmony of Place:

geometrical order of architectural space vs. human experience of place - searching for a common language in the designing process.

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Abstract

The paper is an attempt at approaching the issue of harmony in architectural space from the two complementary perspectives. The other one is the harmony of space as perceived by those who experience it- users and occupants.
