Ana Cláudia Romano Ribeiro works at the Department of Humanities [Letras] of Universidade Federal de São Paulo. Graduated in Humanities [Letras] (Universidade Federal de Juiz de Fora) and Ethnology (University Paris X - Nanterre), she made her PhD, funded by FAPESP (Fundação de Amparo à Pesquisa do Estado de São Paulo) in Literary Theory and History at Universidade Estadual de Campinas, with a research stay at the Università degli Studi di Firenze (with a scholarship granted by CAPES - Coordenação de Aperfeiçoamento de Pessoal de Nível Superior). Part of her doctoral research was published in *A terra austral conhecida* (Genebra, 1676), by Gabriel de Foigny (Translation, presentation and notes, Campinas, Editora da UNICAMP, 2011). In 2010 she was junior visiting scholar at the Università degli Studi di Milano having received a scholarship from Progetto UniALA (for researchers from Latin America), co-funded by Fondazione CARIPLO (Cassa di Risparmio delle Province Lombarde). She is currently researcher at the Department of Classical Studies of Instituto de Estudos da Linguagem at the Universidade Estadual de Campinas, where she develops her post-doctoral project related to Thomas More's Utopia (translation and stylistic study). Part of this research was funded by CNPq (Conselho Nacional de Desenvolvimento Científico e Tecnológico) and by FAPESP. She is a member of the research groups "Renascimento e Utopia" (CNPq / UNICAMP), "U-TOPOS - sobre Pesquisa Centro Utopia" (UNICAMP), "Intertextualidade na literatura latina: teorias e práticas intertextuais na literatura latina e sua recepção" (CNPq / UNICAMP) and "Grupo de Tradução e estudos da Antiguidade e Tradição Clássicas" (CNPq / UNIFESP). She's also a member of the Renaissance Society of America. Ana Cláudia Romano Ribeiro co-publishes the academic journal *Morus - Utopia e Renascimento* and co-organizes scientific meetings and publications related to this journal.
