Title: The Poets of Territorial Space in the Garbe al-Andalus of the First Renaissance (11th to 13th Centuries)

Abstract

The territorial space of our focus locates in the Iberian Peninsula. It is delimited to the West and takes the designation of Garbe al-Andalus in the historical period under study: the end of the 10th to the 13th century. We will find almost five dozen essential poets in this brief historical period of about 250 years.
